Council tears down illegal ads

MBSA enforcement officers continue efforts in Section U6, Shah Alam

SHAH Alam City Council (MBSA) enforcement officers managed to remove 252,698 illegal advertisements in 2016.

The banners, bunting and even flyers advertised everything from illegal loans, property auctions and lorry rentals to tuition classes and information on traditional medicine.

The advertisements were found on trees and lamp posts, with some even blocking street signage, leading to confusion among motorists.

This month, enforcement officers from four MBSA branches carried out another sweep of illegal advertisements, this time in

Subang Permai, Section U6, Shah Alam.

MBSA corporate communications head Shahrin Ahmad said those who wished to advertise their business and products through banners, posters, bunting or billboards, must first get a temporary permit from the council.

Placing illegal advertisements is an offence under the council's Advertisement By-Law (MBSA) 2007.
